### Student Schedules

Students have been given several opportunities to request adjustments in course selections for the upcoming school year. At this time, no additional requests for changes are being accepted. Requests will not be accepted again until the start of school. At that time, changes that are possible will be assessed a \$10.00 fee. Once school begins, schedule changes will be made through the guidance counselors.

### Fourth Quarter Academic Monograms and Certificates

Students who achieved high honors or honors during the fourth quarter and at least two other quarters during the 2009-2010 school year will receive their monograms and certificates in August when they return to school. Graduating **Seniors** will receive theirs in the mail sometime this summer. Students who achieved these grades during the first three quarters received their awards either at Senior Awards Night or during an underclassmen honors assembly.

### Student Withdrawal Tuition Refund Policy

The Evansville Catholic Interparochial High School Board has put into effect the following schedule to calculate tuition refunds:

**100% Refund**—All Student Withdrawals received prior to July 30 of the new school year.

**75% -** Authorized Student Withdrawals received prior to August 31 of the new school year.

**50% Refund**—Authorized Student Withdrawals received prior to November 30 of the new school year.

**25% Refund**— Authorizes Student Withdrawals received prior to January 31 of the new school year

**0% Refund**—Student Withdrawals received on or after February 1 of the new school year.

### 4th Quarter Report Cards

Fourth quarter report cards were mailed on **Friday, May 28th**. If you did not receive your copy or have any questions regarding your student's report card, contact *Mrs. Barb Klein* at Ext. 221. You can also check grades on Parent Connect on the Web.

### Student Transcripts

Please make your transcript requests well in advance of the date transcripts are needed. **All requests must be submitted in writing and a \$5.00 fee must be included for each transcript.** The request must be made by the student if he/she is 18 years of age or older. Parents must request transcripts for those students under 18. The

request must include the student's name, year of graduation, and the name and address where the transcript is to be mailed. All transcript requests must be signed.

If your son or daughter will not be returning to Memorial for the 2010-2011 school year, please contact **Mrs. Lisa Popham** as soon as possible. A withdrawal form **MUST** be filled out by the parent in order for records to be transferred to other schools.

**TIES:** Neckties are to be properly tied and worn from 7:30 A.M. until the end of the school day **during the 2nd Quarter and the 3rd Quarter.**

### **BOYS and GIRLS**

Parents need to purchase pants from Artex, Lands End or Dockers; be wary of others that may be marked "uniform approved". The above pants are the only pants that are uniform approved for 2009-10.

Pants must have belt loops and cannot have jeans-like stitching or patch pockets. Pants may not have split seams or frayed legs. Pants must fit properly and be worn at the natural waistline.

**SHIRTS:** During the 1st Quarter and the 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter school uniform monogrammed polo shirts may be substituted for the uniform blouse. The shirt must be white, royal or navy blue in color. It must be purchased from the UNIFORM SUPPLIER and have the appropriate UNIFORM SUPPLIER embroidered Reitz Memorial High School logo on it. The shirt, which may be long or short sleeved, must be properly tucked in the slacks.

**SHOES:** Properly tied or fastened dress shoes appropriate for school are to be worn. **Shoes must be leather and only black or brown in color. "Boat" shoes are acceptable.** Moccasins, sandals, canvas shoes and athletic shoes, and boots are unacceptable for school wear. No open back shoes or shoes resembling athletic shoes will be permitted. Shoes must have a closed heel. The wearing of athletic shoes is permitted for medical reasons upon the presentation of a note to the Assistant Principal for Student Services from a medical doctor stating their necessity. This permission is limited to one week. A parental note is not sufficient.

## 2011 TUITION LOANS AVAILABLE

Evansville Teachers Federal Credit Union (ETFCU) has been chosen to provide financing for tuition loans to parents of students of Reitz Memorial and Mater Dei High Schools for the 2010-11 school year. ETFCU has established a special low rate of 5.95% for these loans and does not charge an application fee or prepayment penalties. Those who wish to apply must join the credit union if they are not already members; however, the credit union will pay the \$5 opening deposit required to join for those taking part in this loan program. A copy of the tuition invoice is required at the time of application. Parents who are interested should contact ETFCU's Lending Call Center at (812) 469-9930 or 1-800-800-9271. Applications are available at the school offices or at any of ETFCU's ten area office locations.

October you will receive a check for the books that were sold. The Patron's Club keeps only \$3 less for each book sold. This is a service provided by the Patron's Club to help make selling and buying used books easier for the students and parents. Please encourage your students to turn in their books. We will again give admission preference to those who have turned in books and to those who have students at Memorial for the first time. Also, if the parents send their students to buy the books, that is great; just remember to give them two checks; so that they can buy their used books AND their new books. ## REITZ MEMORIAL HAS THREE LILLY WINNERS

Wednesday night, May 12<sup>th</sup> was a proud night for Memorial as three of our **Seniors**, *Caitlyn Hammack*, *Olivia O'Dell*, and *Will Sievern*, were honored with the Vanderburgh Community Foundation Lilly Endowment Scholarship at a banquet held at the Evansville Country Club. *Andrew Kasha* was named an alternate for this prestigious honor. The Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship Program is a highly competitive scholarship program which provides full tuition, required fees, and an annual stipend of \$800 for required books for four years of full-time undergraduate study at any accredited college or university in Indiana. A few of the requirements include: being in the top 10% of their graduating class, having a minimum GPA of 5.0/6.0 scale, having a minimum SAT score of 1800 or ACT score of 27, and being an Indiana resident who resides in or attends school in Vanderburgh County. Students go through a lengthy application and interview process.

Thirty-five area students applied for this year's Lilly scholarship and Memorial had four of the ten finalists. Four winners were chosen with Memorial having three of them and one alternate. In total, Memorial had four of the eight winners! *Caitlyn* will attend DePauw University in the fall and is planning to study pre-medicine. *Olivia* has enrolled at Indiana University to pursue a degree in speech and hearing sciences. *Will* has been accepted to the University of Notre Dame and plans to study biology/pre-medicine. *Andrew* received a \$1,000 scholarship which he will use at Purdue University where he will study Biomedical Engineering.

### APPLY EARLY

If a student is strongly interested in admission at a particular school, it is highly recommended that he/she apply **before** Thanksgiving. This means that SAT or ACT scores must be available from the previous spring or September/October test dates.

IU has a February 1 closing date for Freshmen applications. Purdue changed their admission notification last year and did not notify acceptance, denial or deferral until after December 5<sup>th</sup>. However, they still processed applications according to date received. It is important to check the application deadline for your student's college interest. Also, since admission is based on the "competition pool" of applicants, as time goes on, the minimum GPA requirement tends to rise at a lot of schools.

**COLLEGE NEWS**

It is recommended that students and families visit some campuses over the summer. You and your student won't get the "real" feeling about a campus since only summer classes are in session. Valuable information can be learned anyway. Admissions Offices are open all year and can answer questions and arrange tours. By the beginning of **Senior** year, a student should have choices narrowed down to two or three preferences. All schools now have web-sites that students can access for a lot of information. However, a "virtual tour" should not replace an on-site visit to a school.

Don't miss out on the FREE opportunity to access the College Board's "**My College Quickstart**" site. Go to **[www.collegeboard.com](http://www.collegeboard.com)** and click on "**For Students.**" You will find a blinking icon in the lower left side. By clicking on it, you will have access to 1) the College Board's Web-based careers, majors and college search tool, 2) explanations for the answers to every question on the 2009 PSAT, 3) answers and explanations for sample higher-level math questions students might encounter on the SAT, and 4) student written sample essays for the SAT practice essay question that was on the 2010 PSAT score report.

website that can answer lots of questions that parents and students might have concerning education and careers from birth through college. Check it out!

### SAT/ACT INFORMATION

It is important to register for the SAT and ACT tests as early as possible. Certain dates get filled up in the Evansville area.

It is highly recommended that students take both the ACT and SAT as the two tests measure different strengths. The ACT measures what a student has learned thus far in school. The SAT is more of an aptitude test that tests reasoning and verbal skills. The ACT has four components (English, Math, Reading, Science, and an optional Writing Test). The SAT has three components (Critical Reading, Math and a required Writing Test). The ACT has no penalty for guessing. The SAT takes points off for wrong answers. The ACT will send one score report to schools and allows students to select the test date that they want sent. SAT sends all scores from all test dates. Most colleges will base their admission decision on the highest score recorded. Also, a few colleges will accept **only** ACT scores.

Since the Writing Testing is automatically part of the SAT it is advisable that students take the optional Writing Test on the ACT. The majority of Colleges/Universities seem to be requiring the Writing Test. If your student is absolutely positive which college he/she will be attending next year, they can check with that schools Office of Admission to ascertain what is required.

It takes three to four weeks for test scores to be available. Colleges and Universities will not make a decision concerning admission until test scores from either ACT or SAT are available.

### ATHLETES

If there is a chance you might play a sport in college, you must register with the NCAA (National Collegiate Athletic Association) at the end of your **Junior** year. Registration is on-line at [www.ncaaclearinghouse.org](http://www.ncaaclearinghouse.org). There are two extra important steps after that: request that Memorial send your transcript to the Clearinghouse **and** when you take the SAT/ACT include the Eligibility Center as one of your four free choices to receive your scores. The Clearinghouse code is 9999. Scores **must** come directly from SAT/ACT headquarters. If you don't list the Clearinghouse as a recipient on your original test registration, you can still request scores be sent to the NCAA, but it will cost \$9.50 or more.

### PSAT/NMSQT TEST DATE

The **PSAT/NMSQT** test date for all **Sophomores** and **Juniors** is **Wednesday, October 13, 2010**. This is the test that can make **Juniors** eligible for National Merit Scholarships and expose all students to the SAT..

This service also provides parents the ability to view your child's account balance through a web site called MyNutrikids.com. By having money in each child's account prior to entering the cafeteria, we find the lunch lines move along much faster so your child has more time to eat and be with friends.

Also, parents will have the ability to print out a copy of their child's eating history report. This history report will show you all dates and times that your child has purchased a breakfast and / or lunch within the past thirty days.

These new services were available on May 3, 2010.

To access these services:

Simply go to the school web site at [www.reitzmemorial.org](http://www.reitzmemorial.org). Click on the Student Life link. Click on the MyNutrikids.com link. From this site you will create your account and add money to your child's school meal account. All you need is your child's name, student ID number and school ZIP code. The instructions will guide you through the easy online account set up process.

Things to know: If you have more than one child at Memorial, you can handle all online prepayments from the same online account. Payments may be made through an existing PayPal account or with a major credit or debit card. In order to use the online prepayment service, a small convenience fee for each transaction will be assessed to cover the bank fees. The convenience fee is \$1.75 per deposit transaction. Parents placing money into multiple meal accounts will only be assessed the \$1.75 fee once per deposit transaction. Reitz Memorial High School will not profit from the use of this site.

We are very excited to offer these new services. However, if you choose not to take advantage of the online prepayment service you may continue to make advance payments via check, which should be made payable to Reitz Memorial High School. Please write your **child's full name** on the check.
